






Piracy Update






Other Regional Maritime Security Threats

Previous 12 months significant events

- IRTB 018: 3 Mar 20: MV Gladiolus (Conflict Related / Terrorism)
- IRTB 019: 17 May 20: MV Stolt Apal (Suspicious Activity – Terrorism?)
- IRTB 020: 19 Aug 20: MV Aegean II (Suspicious Activity – Armed Robbery)
- IRTB 021: 3 Oct 20: MT Syra (Conflict Related)





Conclusion & Key Takeaways

- Piracy remains suppressed
- There has been an increase in other maritime crime
- The threat from terrorism / spillover of armed conflict in both Yemen and potentially Mozambique exists
- There remains no 'conflict in Yemen' related direct threat to non SLC merchant traffic

- Operators act as per BMP-5: If we don't know we cannot help
- If you can, take photos and records: accuracy in reporting avoids disinformation
- People Force Flow Aircraft and Capacity Building are required for the mission. We need contributions
- Communication across MICs builds the picture. Security comes from the sum of its parts
