COMMANDER'S VISION


A global maritime partnership aligned in **common purpose**

- Support effective jurisdiction.

- Comprehensive approach, focusing development at the regional level.
- Common training objectives across the region (UNODC LNO).
- Tailored and focused on promoting regional leadership (via in-house training).
- Enables more members to contribute in new ways.

Status

- Increased Force Flow.
- Capacity Building Division Operational (IOC).
- UNODC LNO Jan 21.
- Co-location of CTFs BWCs and Staffs Summer 21.
- HQ Re-org ECD summer of 21.



Operational Update

- **Living with COVID** reducing impact to Operations.
- CTF150 conducting operations with a number of boarding and drug seizure's conducted in recent weeks.
- CTF151 continues to assist with the suppression of piracy and has undertaken medical evacuation support to merchant community.
- CTF152 continues to conduct maritime security operations in the Arabian Gulf.
- **SHADE Conference** conducted including representation from India, Russia, China and Industry.
- CMF encourages adherence to BMP5 and good evidence collection (video, photography, radar plots) and reporting to support investigations.
- CMF is drafting guidance for merchant shipping response to approaches by suspected militia for discussion.
