059	<u>Attack</u>	 UKMTO was made aware of an incident in the vicinity of 17° 19′ 00″N - 040° 32′ 48″ E. The Bahamas flagged passenger vessel CRYSTAL SYMPHONY was transiting the Red Sea approximately 150 nautical miles northwest of Al Hudaydah, Yemen. CRYSTAL SYMPHONY had transited northwards through the Bab el Mandeb with AlS switched off, following guidance given by the CMF JMIC. Shortly after transiting the Bab el Mandeb strait the vessel was targeted by a communications challenge on VHF by an organization claiming to be the Yemeni Navy. The entity demanded that the vessel turn on its AlS. Shortly after this communication, a crew member reported a loud bang and a cabin window on CRYSTAL SYMPHONY's Port side was discovered to have cracked. There has been no clarification on the entity that called on VHF, nor the actual cause of the window damage. Investigations are understood to be ongoing at the time of issue. The vessel and crew were reported to be safe with no injuries sustained and CRYSTAL SYMPHONY continued to her next port of call without further incident.

060	<u>Incident</u>	O22300UTC Apr 24 UKMTO received a report of a vessel experiencing disruption to electronic navigation systems (GPS/AIS) between 2 nd April 2300UTC and 3 rd April 0100UTC, in the vicinity of position 27 ⁰ 11′ 00″ N - 051 ⁰ 07′ 00″ E, approximately 95 nautical miles east of Ras Al Zour, Saudi Arabia.
