- 1. The Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) published a story about the plight of Yemeni fishermen on their website last week. Photos show the fishermen with orange life jackets and large iceboxes corresponding with sighting reports that we received last year. Media story a. refers.
- 2. 26 drug busts in under four months. An impressive tally from CTF-150 which lists their counternarcotics seizures on the CMF website since Canada took command in 27 January 2021. They will hand over command to the Royal New Zealand Navy in July. See media story b.

a. Fishing in the middle of a war

The ongoing conflict in Yemen has decimated the country's Red Sea fishing industry. Fishing boats, ports and processing sites have been destroyed or damaged. Fishermen have been killed and injured. A polluted marine environment has destroyed the artisanal fishing sector and displaced thousands of fishermen along with their families.

b. Royal Canadian Navy led task force making an impact on regional smuggling

Since Canada assumed command of CTF-150 on 27 January, 2021, the task force's counternarcotics efforts have been substantial. In partnership with navies from the United States, the United Kingdom, France and Canada, CTF-150 has led a total of 26 drug busts.

d. Spurt in Non-Traditional Maritime Security Threats In Indian Ocean

The shipping lanes of the Indian Ocean Region (IOR) are vital for global trade and commerce. These lanes are traversed by thousands of ships every month. Along with regular commercial shipping, the lanes are also used for a whole range of illegitimate activities that imperil both regional and global security. The Indian Navy has set up an Information Fusion Centre for IOR (IFC-IOR) that's graduated to become a nerve centre for collection and sharing of data relevant to keeping the IOR free and secure.

e. World's Largest Civilian Hospital Ship Passes Sea Trials

Mercy Ships announced this week that the world's largest civilian hospital ship Global Mercy has now completed deep water sea trials, one of the final milestones before departing for service in sub-Saharan Africa. Mercy Ships uses hospital ships to deliver free, world-class healthcare services, capacity building, and sustainable development to those with little access in the developing world.

f. EU Naval Force Somalia Operation ATALANTA conducts first trilateral exercise with Japanese and Djiboutian forces.

On the 10th of May, the EU, Japan and Djibouti carried out a joint naval exercise in the Gulf of Aden in a continued effort to strengthen the efficiency of tactical procedures between navies. The exercise builds on the joint naval exercise and joint port call in Djibouti between Operation Atalanta Combined Joint Task Force 465 and the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force last October.
