# 2. Shipping Industry to remove Indian Ocean 'High Risk Area' designation as piracy threat subsides

A group of shipping industry bodies have decided to remove the Indian Ocean "High Risk Area", reflecting a significantly improved piracy situation in the region, the International Chamber of Shipping announced 22 Aug 2022. The UN International Maritime Organization (IMO) was informed of the decision made by International Chamber of Shipping (ICS), BIMCO, International Marine Contractors Association (IMCA), INTERCARGO, INTERTANKO and Oil Companies International Marine Forum (OCIMF), ahead of the next meeting of the IMO's Maritime Safety Committee scheduled to start on 31 Oct 2022. The removal will be effective from January 1, 2023, allowing charterers, ship-owners and operators time to adapt to the changed threat from piracy.

#### 3. Brazil assumes command of Middle East anti-piracy task force

On 18 Aug 2022 Pakistan turned over command of a multinational naval task force to Brazil during an afternoon ceremony at the U.S. Navy base in Bahrain. Brazilian Navy Rear Adm. Nelson de Oliveira Leite assumed command of Combined Task Force (CTF) 151 from Pakistan Navy Commodore Ahmed Hussain.

#### 4. Ukraine's grain shipping corridor appears to be working

Ukrainian grain flows are pushing down global prices as the newly opened crop-export corridor shows initial success. More than 500,000 tons of foodstuffs aboard 21 ships were exported from the country's major Black Sea ports in the first half of August, under a deal agreed late last month. That's far below a normal pace, but is providing some relief to grain supplies strained by Russia's invasion and bad weather curbing harvests elsewhere.

#### 5. International Maritime Security Construct (IMSC) holds change of command

On 18 Aug 2022 the International Maritime Security Construct (IMSC) headquarters held a change of command ceremony at the U.S. Navy base in Bahrain between two officers from United Kingdom's Royal Navy. Royal Navy Commodore Ben Aldous assumed command of IMSC from Commodore Don Mackinnon who served as Commander since November 2021.

#### 6. ITF Inspectors recovered \$37 million in unpaid wages to seafarers in 2021

The International Transport Workers' Federation have issued a report showing that union ship inspectors recovered more than \$37 million in unpaid wages to seafarers in 2021 as the crew change crisis raged on. ITF inspectors are present in more than 100 ports across 50 countries. They are trained to look for exploitation, overwork – even for signs of forced labor and modern slavery. On many vessels, inspectors have the right to examine wage accounts, employment contracts, and to review recorded hours of work
