004/Dec/2023	Incident Update 001 Update 002	UKTMO received reports relating to a vessel being attacked within the vicinity of the Bab Al Mandeb (BAM), 15nm West of port Mokha, Yemen. The vessel suffered an upper-deck fire onboard and international search and rescue were informed. All crew were reported as safe, with events reported to UKMTO as a missile attack. Military coalition authorities and warships provided assistance to the afflicted ves- sel, subsequently escorting the vessel out of the BAM where it proceeded to NPoC.
005/Dec/2023	<u>Incident</u> <u>Update 001</u>	UKMTO received a report of an incident in the vicinity of the BAM, 50nm West of port Hodeidah, Yemen. A small boat with 3 armed persons onboard approached a merchant vessel to within 5 cables. Several small arms shots were fired in the general direction of the vessel from the small craft as it approached, and, the embarked armed security team fired warning shots. The small boat veered away and departed the vicinity of the vessel. Having mustered the crew to emergency stations, the reporting vessel was subsequently hailed by an entity declaring itself to be Yemeni authorities, directing the vessel to alter course East towards Yemen, under threat of being fired upon. The reporting vessel then sighted a large airborne object plunge into the water circa 200 metres astern, with a large splash and loud explosive noise observed. The vessel reported that they had not been struck and the CSO confirmed that the vessel had subsequently cleared the area, without further incident and the crew reported as safe.
006/Dec/2023	<u>Incident</u> Update 001	UKMTO received a report of an incident approximately 90nm South of Al Duqm. A vessel reported being followed by 5 or 6 small boats for approximately 90 minutes. Each of the craft had 3 persons on board, who appeared to be in grey uniforms. A machine gun was mounted on the bow of at least one small craft. The Master's report states the small boats had powerful outboards, which the Master assessed as likely being able to achieve 25 knots. The craft came between 6 cables and 8 cables of the vessel, including at least one craft, which repeatedly crossed the reporting vessel's bow. The small boats subsequently cleared away from the vicinity of the reporting vessel, which confirmed that all were safe without further incident.
