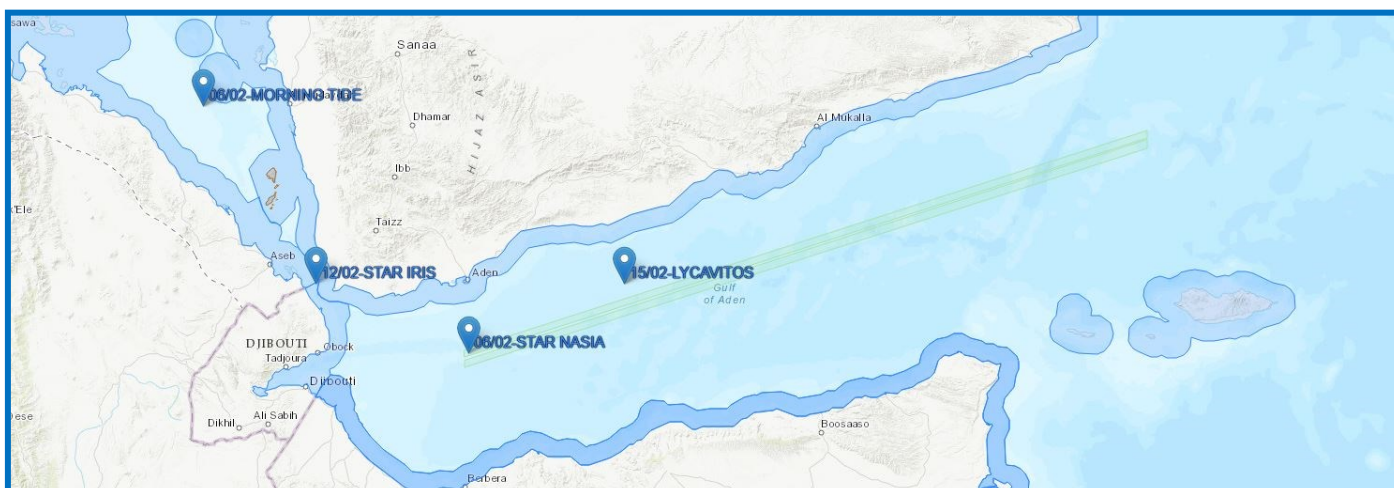


UKMTO Summary Report: 06 - 16 Feb 2024

UKMTO Alerts (formerly Warnings & Advisories)

Incident No.	Category	Remarks
027	Attack Update 001	060050UTC Feb 24 - MORNING TIDE. IMO: 9320506 UKMTO received a report from the master of the Barbados flagged cargo ship MORNING TIDE describing an attack type incident 57 nautical miles West of Al Hudaydah, Yemen. The bridge crew was initially aware at 0019 UTC of a small craft on the vessel's Port side, which was associated with a bright light and a flash. The master's report described a projectile, assumed to have been from a grenade launcher of some sort, which had been fired at his vessel. The projectile passed over the deck from the port side to the starboard side. In doing so the projectile caused some slight damage to the bridge windows, the projectile was not reported to have struck the vessel. No further incidents were reported. The master confirmed that his vessel and crew were safe as it then proceeded to it's next port of call as planned.
028	Attack Update 001	061100UTC Feb 24 - STAR NASIA. IMO: 9361237 UKMTO received reports of a large water-based explosion in the vicinity of a position 50 nautical miles South of Aden, Yemen. The reported explosion was between 20 and 50 metres away from the Port side of the Marshall Islands flagged bulker, cargo ship STAR NASIA. Events were confirmed by the master and Company Security Officer (CSO), who reported that the vessel and crew were safe as the vessel subsequently proceeded to the next port of call.

Incident No.	Category	Remarks
029	Attack Update 001 Update 002	120035UTC Feb 24 - STAR IRIS. IMO: 9284910 UKMTO received a report of an Incident, 40 nautical miles South of Al Mukha, Yemen. The master reported that his vessel had been attacked by two missiles from the direction of his starboard bow. One of the missiles actually hit STAR IRIS and the other splashed in to the water nearby. Only minor damage was caused to STAR IRIS. The vessel and the crew were reported safe and STAR IRIS proceeded to next port of call without any further incidents being reported.
030	Attack Update 001	151345UTC Feb 24 - LYCAVITOS. IMO: 9368857 UKMTO contacted the master of MV LYCAVITOS who reported an explosion approximately 150 metres astern of his vessel. At the time, LYCAVITOS was circa 85 nautical miles East of Aden, Yemen. Although not physically struck by the main body of the vehicle that had caused the explosion the master did note that fragmentation apparently from the blast had struck the ship and caused some minor damage. The reported damage included a punctured upper-deck diesel feed pipe. The crew and the vessel were reported to be safe and the vessel proceeded to its next port of call, albeit by avoiding a transit through the South Red Sea.
