031	Attack Update 001	161331UTC Feb 24 - POLLUX. IMO: 9243320  UKMTO received a report of an incident in the vicinity of 72 nautical miles north west of Al Mukha, Yemen. The master of POLLUX reported that his Panama-flagged tanker had been attacked by a missile, which exploded approximately 100 metres off the port quarter. The master stated that this explosion was from one of three possible missiles, but no further details of the other two missiles were reported. Military authorities responded. No damage to the vessel was identified, the crew and ship were reported to be safe and the vessel subsequently proceeded on to its next port of call without further incident.				
032	Attack Update 001 Update 002 Update 003	182000UTC Feb 24 - RUBYMAR. IMO: 9138898.  UKMTO received a report of an incident 35 nautical miles south of Al Mukha, Yemen. The master of Belize-flagged bulker RUBYMAR reported an explosion approximately 50 meters off the starboard side of the vessel resulting in shrapnel penetrating the engine room. As a function of the damage sustained and engine failure, the crew subsequently abandoned the vessel. Other vessels in the area and military authorities provided assistance to RUBYMAR with the vessel LOBIVIA rescuing RUBYMAR's crew from two ship's boats and landing them safely in Djibouti without any reported casualties. The vessel remains at anchor, down by the stern and pending potential salvage discussions. Appropriate authorities and agencies have been informed.

033	Attack Update 001 Update 002	190955UTC Feb 24 - SEA CHAMPION. IMO: 9299915.  UKMTO received a report of an incident 100 nautical miles east of Aden, Yemen. The master of a Greece-flagged bulker SEA CHAMPION initially reported an explosion approximately 15 metres off the starboard side of the vessel. Subsequently, the master reported a second explosion in the air approximately 15 metres off the starboard side of SEA CHAMPION. The master found evidence of shrapnel and damage to paintwork on the superstructure from this explosion. SEA CHAMPION and crew were reported to be safe before the vessel left the area and proceeded to the next port of call without further incident.			
034	Suspicious Approach Update 001	191746UTC Feb 24 - ANYA. IMO: 9730268.  UKMTO received a report of two Uncrewed Aerial Systems (UAS) following the Cyprus-flagged bulker ANYA for approximately 30 minutes. The two UAS were assessed by the master to have been at a height of about 100 metres above the vessel before being observed to clear the immediate area. ANYA and crew were reported to be safe whilst authorities investigated. Other vessels were advised by UKMTO to transit with caution and report any suspicious activity to the organization whilst ANYA proceeded to her next port of call without further incident.			
035	Attack Update 001	191820UTC Feb 24 - NAVIS FORTUNA. IMO: 9404455.  UKMTO received a report of an incident 60 nautical miles north of Djibouti. The master of NAVIS FORTUNA had reported that the Marshall Islands-flagged bulk carrier had been hit by an Uncrewed Aerial System, which had resulted in superficial damage to the starboard side of the accommodation superstructure. The crew was reported to be safe and the vessel subsequently proceeded to its next port of call without further incident.			
036	<u>Attack</u>	210027UTC Feb 24 - LAVENDER. IMO: 9463750  UKMTO received time-late reports from the master of the Marshall Islands-flagged bul LAVENDER following an explosion and a correlated flash from an assumed drone. The Uncrewed Aerial System had been sighted about one nautical mile off the vessel in the Southern Red Sea approximately 40 nautical miles to the west of Al Hudaydah, Yemen LAVENDER and her crew were confirmed to be unharmed whilst the vessel proceeded to its next port of call without further incident.			
037	Attack Update 001 Update 002	220745UTC Feb 24 - ISLANDER. IMO: 9136565 UKMTO received a report of an incident 70 nautical miles south east of Aden, Yemen. The vessel ISLANDER, a Palau-flagged general cargo ship, had been attacked and hit by two missiles, which resulted in fires on the upper deck and resulted in the vessel sustaining some minor damage once fires had been extinguished. ISLANDER and crew were subsequently reported to be safe as she proceeded to her next port of call without further incident.
