052	<u>Attack</u>	150205UTC Mar 24 - PACIFIC 01. IMO: 9395379. UKMTO received a report from the Panama flagged tanker PACIFIC 01 of an attack in the vicinity of 15° 12' 39"N - 041° 44' 25"E approximately 76 nautical miles west of Al Hudaydah, Yemen. Following a daylight inspection of the vessel the master reported that the vessel had not actually been hit and confirmed that PACIFIC 01 had not incurred any damage. The crew was confirmed as safe and the vessel proceeded to its next port of call without further incident. Note: Incident 052 was reported in UKMTO Weekly Sumary Report for period 9 Mar to 15 Mar. 053	<u>Attack</u>	151945UTC Mar 24 - MADO. IMO: 9694622. The master of Marshal Islands flagged cargo ship MV MADO reported an explosion approximately 1600 metres off the starboard beam of the ship. MADO was transiting the Southern Red Sea in position 15° 02' 00"N - 041° 48' 00"E approximately 65 nautical miles west of Al Hudaydah, Yemen. 054	<u>Attack</u>	170029UTC Mar 24 - MADO. IMO:9694622. UKMTO received a report of an attack from the master Marshal Islands flagged cargo ship MV MADO in the vicinity of 12 ⁰ 15' 00"N - 0460 16' 00"E approximately 85 nautical miles east of Aden, Yemen. The master reported an explosion approximately 200 metres off the vessel's starboard bow. No damage to the vessel was reported whilst the crew was reported to be safe. Approach</th><th>200302UTC Mar 24 - Piracy Type Incident (vessel not named). UKMTO received a report of an incident in the vicinity of 14<sup>0</sup> 19' 54" n="">0 43' 54"E approximately 160 nautical miles southeast of Salalah, Oman. The master reported a suspicious approach by a small craft astern, approximately 550 metres from the vessel. The small craft had a visible ladder and carried seven crew members. The small craft followed the vessel for approximately 20 minutes. In response, the reporting vessel's armed security team fired a warning shot and the small craft subsequently left the area. The reporting vessel continued its passage to its next port of call without further incident. • As a piracy type incident, a correlating CMF-JMIC InfoNote is not intended.

The aim of this operation is to focus CP efforts in the deterrence of illicit, non-state use of the high seas, develop regional leadership capacity and reassure the international community, to maintain enduring maritime security within the CTF 151 area of responsibility, and, uphold rules based order.
