047	<u>Attack</u>	081315UTC Mar 24 - PROPEL FORTUNE. IMO: 9500699  The master of Singapore flagged cargo ship MV PROPEL FORTUNE (IMO: 9500699) reported two explosions approximately 300 metres ahead of the ship through the Company Security Officer. PROPEL FORTUNE was transiting the Gulf of Aden in position 11 <sup>0</sup> 44' 46"N - 044 <sup>0</sup> 54' 39"E approximately 50 nautical miles south southeast of Aden, Yemen. Coalition warships in the vicinity of the incident responded and provided assistance. PROPEL FORTUNE did not experience any damage and all of the crew on board were reported to be safe, with no injuries notified. The vessel proceeded to its next port of call without further incident. CMF-JMIC analysis concludes that PROPEL FORTUNE was likely targetted on the basis of outdated ownership data.
048	<u>Attack</u>	111006UTC Mar 24 - PINOCCHIO. IMO:9400112  UKMTO received a report of an attack from the master of Liberian flagged container ship MV PINOCCHIO in the vicinity of 14° 52′ 06″N - 041° 32′ 00″E approximately 71 nautical miles southwest of Saleef, Yemen. The master reported a sound of an explosion approximately half a mile off the vessel's port side. No damage was caused to the vessel and crew were reported safe. Coalition Forces investigated as PINOCHIO proceeded to its next port of call without further incident.  • For further details on this incident see: CMF-JMIC InfoNote 11/03/01

049	<u>Hijack</u>	120810UTC Mar 24 - ABDULLAH. IMO: 9745598.  UKMTO received a report of an incident in the vicinity of 01° 31' 38"N - 054° 52' 10"E approximately 600 nautical miles east of Mogadishu, Somalia. The company security officer of the ABDULLAH, a Bangladesh flagged bulker reported twenty two unauthorized and armed personnel had boarded the vessel. No casualties were reported. Coalition forces operating in the area provided assistance. The vessel is currently heading towards the coast of Somalia  • A correlating CMF-JMIC InfoNote is not intended.	
050	<u>Attack</u>	140418UTC Mar 24 - SUEZ FURY. IMO: 9301536.  UKMTO received a report of an attack in the vicinity of 12° 05' 09"N - 045° 31' 04"E approximately 50 nautical miles southeast of Aden, Yemen. The Liberian flagged tanker SUEZ FURY's master reported a large splash in the water about 500 meters from the starboard side of his bridge. The vessel did not sustain any damage and the crew were reported to be safe. SUEZ FURY proceeded to its next port of call without further incident.  • A correlating CMF-JMIC InfoNote is not intended.	
051	Attack Update 1  142210UTC Mar 24 - FUXING V. IMO: 9381196.  UKMTO received a report of an attack in the vicinity of 14° 24′ 35″N - 042° 11′ 14″E approximately 50 nautical miles southwest of AL Hudaydah, Yemen. The Liberian flagged bulker FUXING V's master reported seeing two missiles flying over the vessel and heard two loud blasts in the distance, but did not sight any visual evidence of those explosions. FUXING V reported no damage and the crew is safe. FUXING V is proceeding to its next port of call without further incident being reported.  • Correlating CMF-JMIC InfoNote not yet available at time of release.		
052	Attack Update 1 Update 2	150205UTC Mar 24 - PACIFIC 01. IMO: 9395379.  UKMTO received a report from the Panama flagged tanker PACIFIC 01 of an attack in the vicinity of 15° 12' 39"N - 041° 44' 25"E approximately 76 nautical miles west of Al Hudaydah, Yemen. Following a daylight inspection of the vessel the master reported that the vessel had not actually been hit and confirmed that PACIFIC 01 had not incurred any damage. The crew was confirmed as safe and the vessel proceeded to its next port of call without further incident.  • Correlating CMF-JMIC InfoNote not yet available at time of release.
